

H1N1 Novel Influenza A Planning Update
January 20, 2010

There continue to be cases of 2009 H1N1 Influenza in Dodge County. One death due to H1N1 has also occurred in the county in an adult and a possible second one is under investigation. Because influenza is not a reportable disease to the Public Health Unit unless the person is hospitalized or dies of the disease we aren't notified.

Cases of seasonal influenza are starting to be seen around the state.

Although the number of cases of H1N1 seems to have slowed, the state remains under the state of a public health emergency. A possible third wave of the disease is expected.

Vaccine

Since December 2009 H1N1 Influenza vaccine has been available to anyone who would like to be vaccinated.

H1N1 vaccine will continue to be available at the regularly scheduled public health immunization clinics. Clinic days and times are:

- The 1st and 3rd Thursdays of each month from 3:00 pm to 6:00 pm
- The 2nd Thursday of each month from 1:00 pm to 4:00 pm
- The 4th Friday of the each month from 9:00 am to 11:00

H1N1 vaccine will also be offered Monday - Friday from 8:30 am to 4:00 pm on a walk in basis.

These clinics are held at the Dodge County Office Building, 143 East Center Street in Juneau.

There is no cost for the H1N1 vaccine
