## About COAD

When disaster strikes, lives, homes, communities, and businesses may be damaged or destroyed. Those affected often need substantial short-term help and long-term support to put their lives back together.

Community organizations, working in coordination with governmental first responders provide vital assistance. Dodge County non-profits and faith-based organizations have come together to form **Dodge County Community Organizations Active in Disaster (COAD)**.

COAD itself does not provide services to the community, but rather creates a framework to identify existing resources and allows all organizations to work in tandem. Collaboration ensures that services are not being duplicated and improves the delivery of services to county residents following a disaster.

## COAD Core Values

### Cooperation

We need each other—no single member organization has all of the answers for the challenges we may face. Members are treated as partners.

### Communication

We maintain beneficial channels for correspondence, listen carefully to members, and deal openly with concerns. Sharing information among our member organizations about our resources, capacities, accomplishments, and commitments is essential.

### Coordination

We commit ourselves to work together toward our goal of providing the best possible service to those affected by disaster. Through planning and preparation, we facilitate an enhanced response.

### Collaboration

We dedicate ourselves to work together to achieve specific goals. We form partnerships before and during disaster response.
