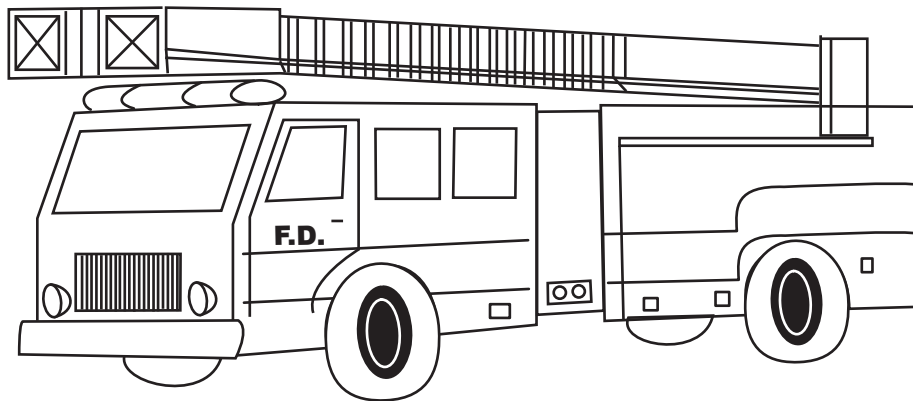
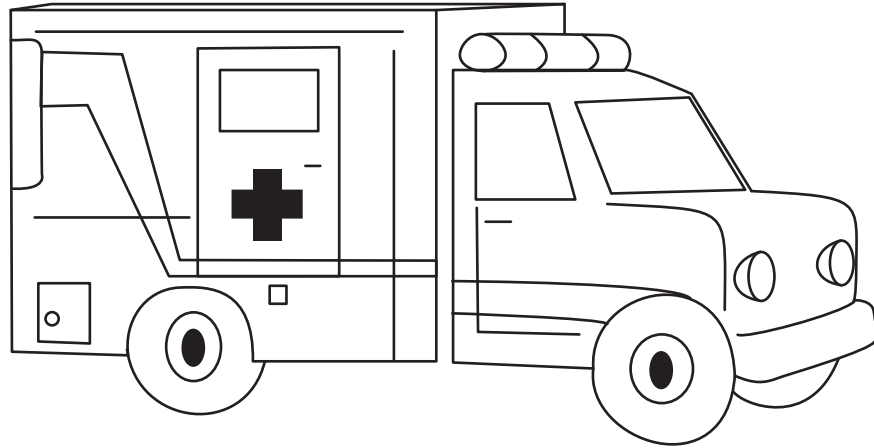
On behalf of the Dodge County Sheriff's Department 911 Communications Division, we would like to thank you for taking the time to go over this book with your child. We also hope that you will fill out the information on the back page and place it near a phone for your child's use in the event of an emergency. Hopefully your child will never have to call 911, but should they need to, knowing what to do is important. Each day dispatch centers in the United States receive more than 250,000 calls for 911. Some callers are children, even as young as 3 years old, asking for help.

It is never too early to begin practicing these things with your child, including learning their name, phone number and address. Explain to your child that 911 is for emergencies only and explain what an actual emergency is. If you or your child have any questions regarding 911, please stop by or call the Dodge County Sheriff's Department at (920) 386-3726.

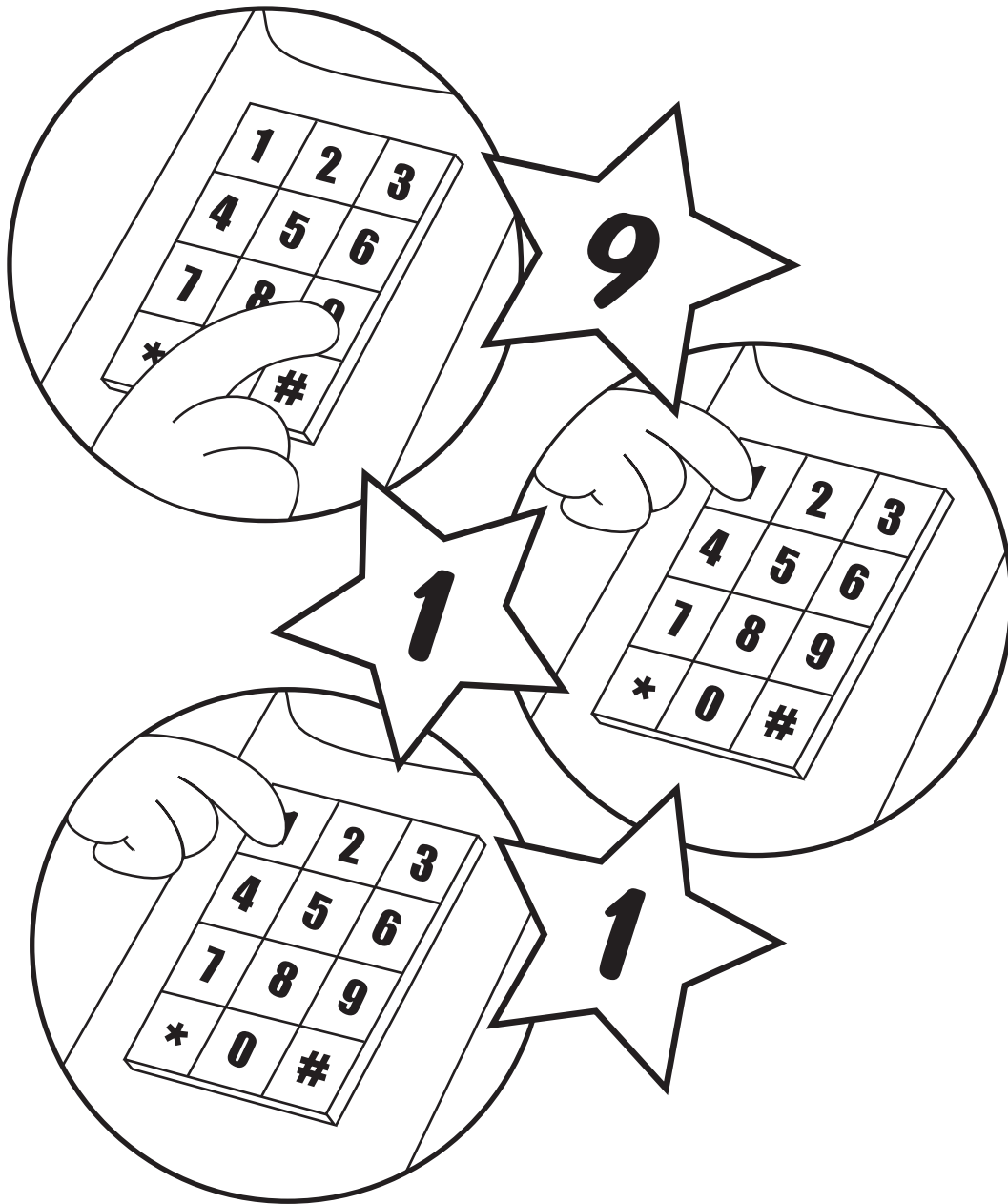

What is 911?



911 is an easy to remember phone number that you call when you need help quickly from an ambulance, fire truck or the police. This is called an emergency.

How do you call 911?



First dial 9, then 1, and then 1 again.

On a cellular phone you may need to then push the green "send" button.

On a land line you need to first listen for a dial tone.

You can call from any working phone, even a pay phone.

No money is needed. It is free to call 911.

Who answers when you call?



***When you call 911 someone called a dispatcher will answer.
Never be afraid to call, they are there to help you!***

What will happen next?

*The dispatcher will ask you some questions,
including:*

Why you are calling?

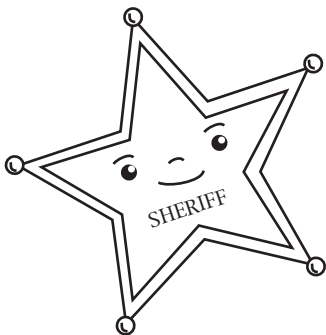
*Tell the dispatcher what your emergency is and if you
need police, fire or an ambulance.*

What is the location or address of the emergency?

*Tell the dispatcher your home address or the place
where your emergency is.*

Your name and phone number?

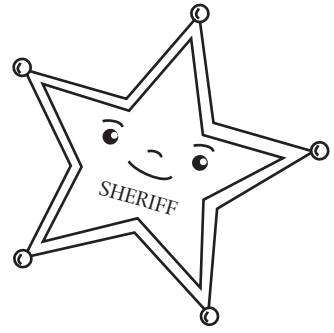
Tell the dispatcher your first and last name and your phone number.



*Do your best to answer all of the questions you
are asked. Make sure that you speak loud and
clear, and never hang up until the dispatcher
says you should.*

Rules of 911

911 is for a fire, to save a life or stop a crime.



- 1. Always call from a safe place.
Never call from a place where you could be in danger.***

- 2. Only call in an emergency. Never call as a game, to practice or as a joke.***

- 3. Stay calm, speak loud and clear.***

- 4. Know your address and phone number.***

- 5. Never hang up until the dispatcher says it is okay.***

- 6. 911 is for people emergencies only.***

- 7. If you are not sure if you have an emergency, call and tell the dispatcher. They will help you.***

You should call 9 1 1 ...



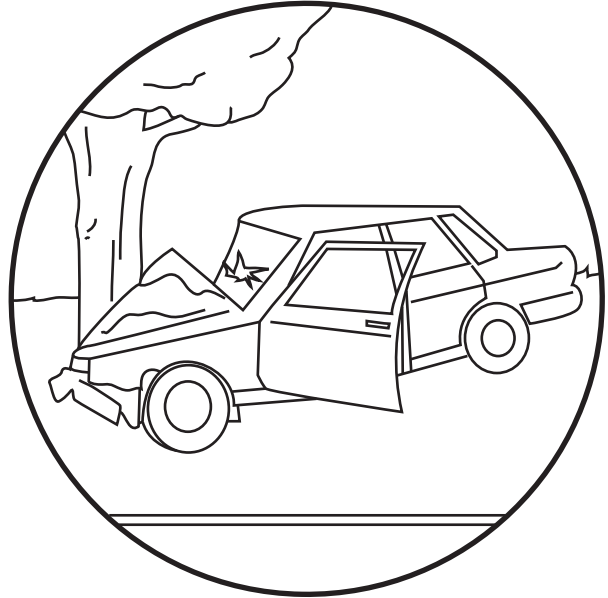
**When you see a house
or another building on fire.**
*If you are inside the burning building,
get out first and then call from a safe place.*

**When someone swallows cleaners
or other chemicals or poisons.**



When someone is drowning.
If you can, throw them something that floats.

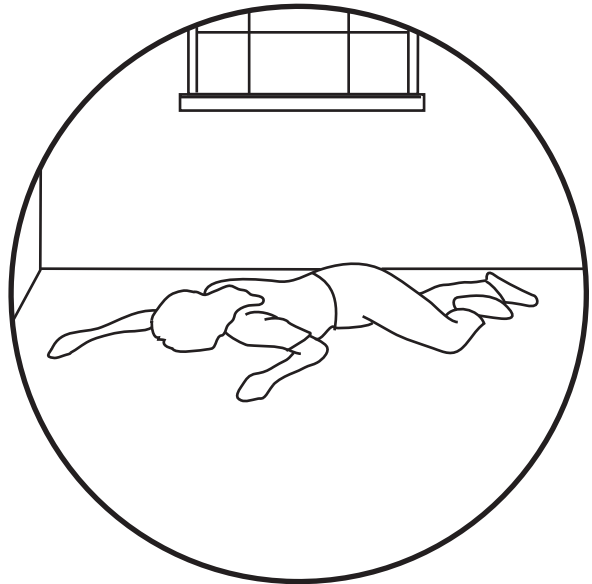
***When there is a car accident
and someone is hurt.***



***When someone is choking
and cannot breathe.
If they are coughing, tell them to keep doing so.***

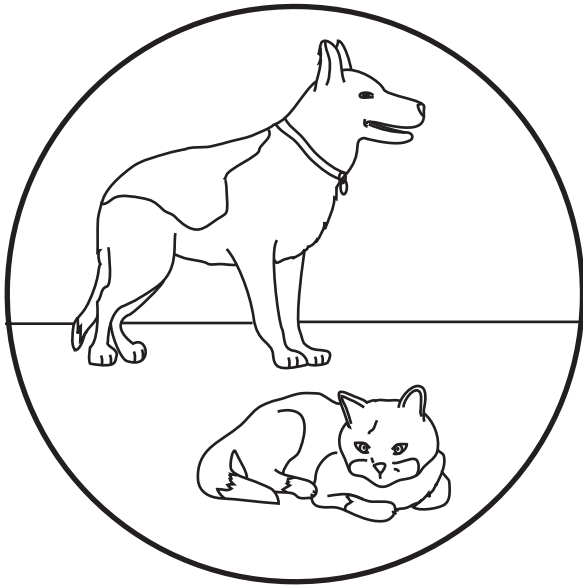


***When someone is hurt or sick,
and they won't wake up.***



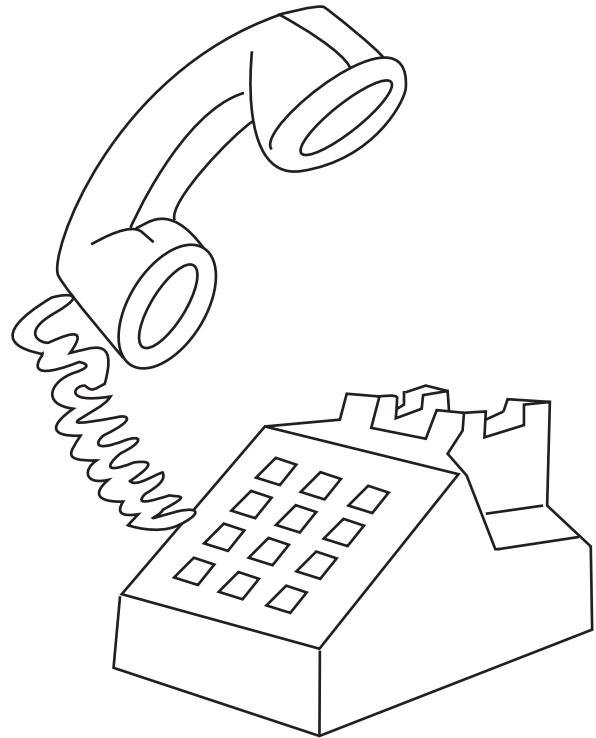
These are emergencies!

You should NOT call if...



***If an animal or pet is injured. Tell your parents or call your pet's doctor.
911 is for people emergencies only.***

***If a crime is not in progress or did not just happen, call the non-emergency phone number.
You will still get the help that you need.***



Never call if you just need help from an adult.

Never call if you just need information from the police.

If you are not sure if it is an emergency, be sure to call and explain this to the dispatcher. They will help you.

*Never call as a joke,
to practice or as a game.*

This can take help away from someone who really needs it.



What if you call by mistake?

Stay on the phone and tell the dispatcher that there is no emergency.

***Otherwise, they will send an officer to check on you. This
can also take help away from someone who really needs it.***

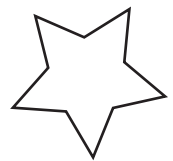
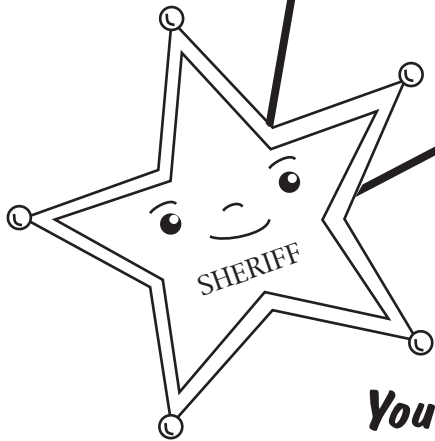
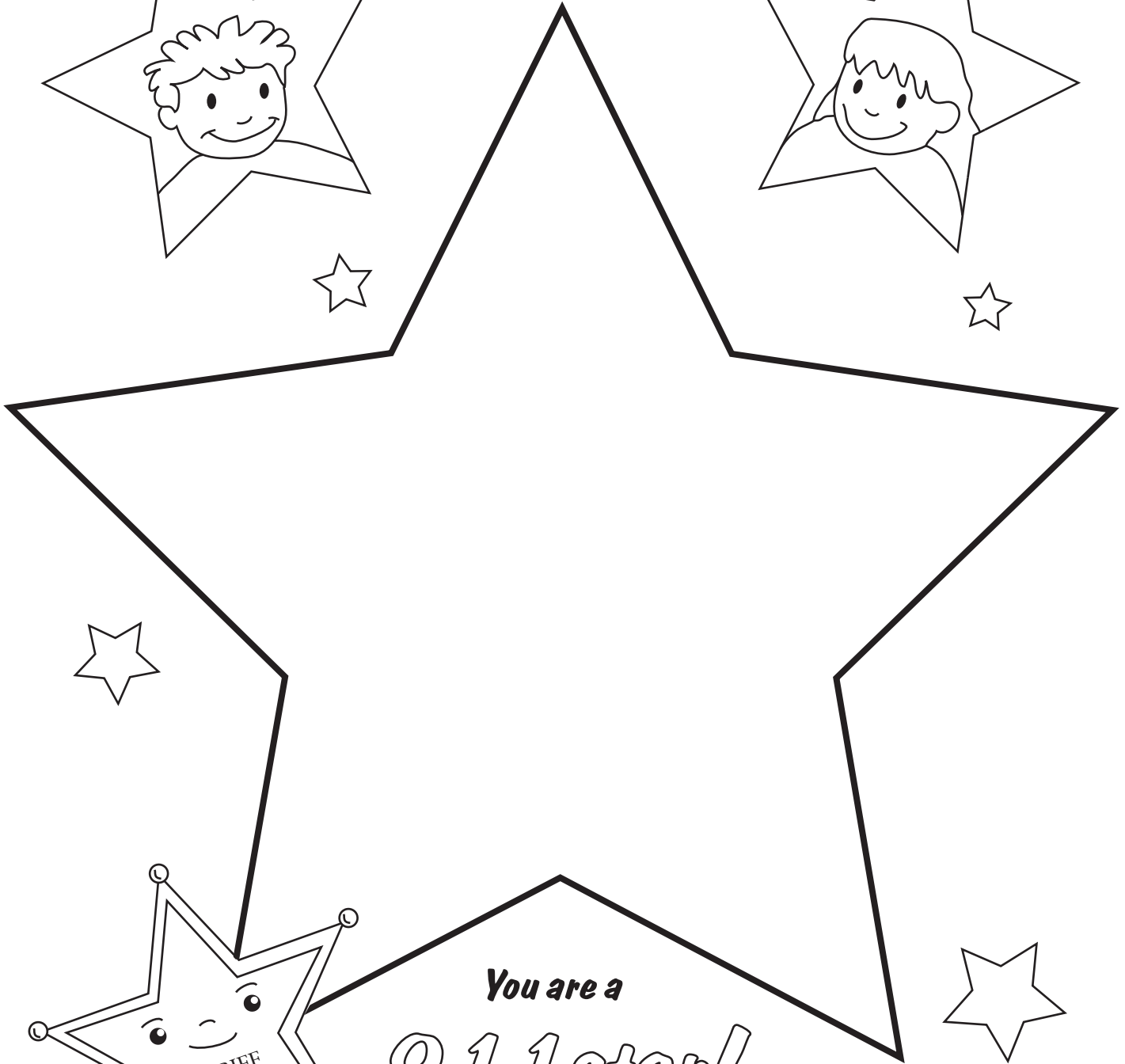
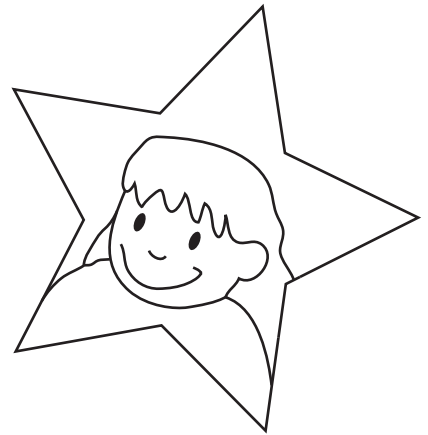
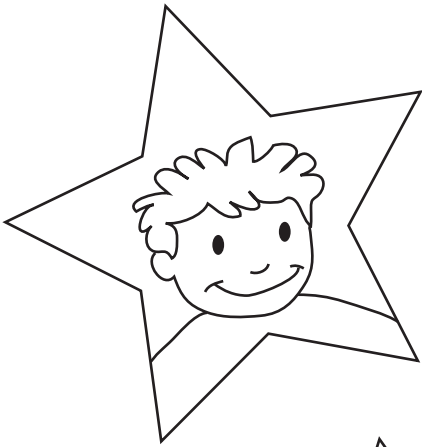
Should you call 911 if...
